


Health & Wellness Corner

Reflection on Pastor Troy's Sermon "Overcoming Doubt," Psalm 77:1-9 TEV

"My voice rises to God, and I will cry aloud; My voice rises to God, and He will hear me," (Psalm 77:1). This year has most certainly provided some "Why is this happening to me?" moments and despite our prayer life and church attendance, we have yet been subjected to wave after wave of

become common again. This two-part article will provide information about seasonal viruses as well as how to manage and prevent them. We will discuss the different viruses and ways to stay healthy and safe from viruses this winter.

What are winter viruses, and how do they spread? Humans can get infected by various viruses, including the winter seasonal viruses known to most people, such as influenza (the flu), coronaviruses, rhinoviruses (the common cold), RSV and the new but now well-known SARS-CoV-2 virus responsible for COVID-19.

Many viruses can spread through aerosols produced by activities such as coughing, sneezing, or even speaking. They can also be transmitted through contact with contaminated surfaces. In order to reduce the spread of these viruses, it is essential to maintain physical distance, wash hands frequently, and refrain from touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands. It's also important to cover your coughs or sneezes and wear a mask if you have any symptoms.

These viruses have similar general symptoms, but some, such as COVID-19 and influenza, can be pretty severe and require hospitalization. Although RSV is usually mild in healthy adults, it can cause severe respiratory distress in both young people and older adults. While clinicians might distinguish between these viruses through medical history and physical examinations, accurate differentiation often requires the use of tests. Stay tuned for Part 2.

trials. We may try to maintain an appearance of having it all together. Yet at night, when sleep doesn't come easy, we lay awake asking God "Why me?" So, we isolate ashamed to share our hearts with others who Pastor reminds us may be a part of an 'Alumni Chapter" of that issue that troubles us who may provide prayerful insight to help us.

Pastor Troy also reminded us that "Doubt can drive us to God." When the psalmist opened with his despair, even still he knew God who would 'hear him.' We too can take our "doubt" to God. The silence we feel is not abandonment, but rather this faith trek to trust Him when all else has failed. And how do

we do that? The Psalmist reminds us to 'recall' what God has done for us. Recall. Yes, God has in fact brought us through "that." And if He delivered us, saved us, brought us through "that," we can then trust Him in "this." I know we might be hurting something fierce right now, but what has God carried us where our 'memory can be a friend to our faith' as Pastor reminds us.

Prayer: LORD, we cry to you. And you, listen. You care and even in the silence, the weight of the sadness, doubt, and confusion, we chase after you, knowing what you've done for others by the word of their testimony, by demonstration of what you have done for us before, we chose once more to trust you in this. In Jesus' name, AMEN.
