### **Health Corner**

#### Kidneys in Trouble: Understanding Chronic Kidney Disease Christopher Brown, MD, MPH

Your kidneys are amazing organs with multiple roles in the body. But like other organs sometimes the kidneys can get damaged and not be able to do their job properly. When this occurs it is called chronic kidney disease or CKD.

What causes CKD? While there are many causes of CKD, the two main culprits are: diabetes and high blood pressure. Both can damage the kidney tissue and hurt the ability of the kidney to do it's job. Other risk factors for CKD include family history, obesity and being African American.

How do you know if you have CKD? The tricky thing about CKD is that it can be without symptoms until the function is almost gone. The best way to know if you have CKD is to ask your clinician to screen for the disease especially if you have risk factors. Clinicians will use blood and urine tests to help with the diagnosis of CKD. Living with CKD: There's no cure for most cases of CKD, but there are ways to manage it and slow down its progression. This might involve: Medications: to manage blood pressure and control diabetes. Healthy diet: low in salt to help with blood pressure control Regular exercise: to stay healthy and manage weight. Limiting smoking: as it is associated with kidney, heart and lung damage

Remember: CKD is a serious condition, but with proper management and healthy lifestyle choices, you can live a long and fulfilling life.

Most importantly, talk to your doctor if you have any concerns about your kidney health. Early detection and management are key to keeping your kidneys happy and healthy!
