



Black History Month

As a young teenager, I used to think that I was out of the "league" of the people that hear from God and could subsequently be used for his glory. So, I just served him how I knew best and saw him as this God from afar that says hi to little ole' me when He feels like! Ha! How foolish I was! One thing I've come to learn is that God is a communicator and He enjoys speaking to and using His children for His glorious plans, especially when they're still young. He mightily used young people in the Bible and our youth are not an exception. Mary was young when she birthed Jesus. David was 15 when he slayed Goliath. At 17, in Gen. 37, God started speaking to Joseph through the dreams that changed his life.

In the heart of bustling, ancient Babylon, three young men—Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego—refused to bow before King Nebuchadnezzar's golden statue, despite the pressure to conform. Though still teenagers, they understood the value of standing for what was right, even in the face of danger. The king had decreed that everyone must worship the statue, or face being thrown into a fiery furnace. But Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego weren't swayed by fear or the threat of death. They stood firm in their beliefs, declaring, "If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us... but even if he does not, we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up." (Daniel 3:17-18).

Their refusal to comply wasn't just about faith—it was a stance for justice and dignity. They fought against the cultural and political pressures that sought to strip them of their identity and rights. Their bold defiance echoed the struggles of today's young leaders in the fight for social justice, from civil rights to racial equality. Just as Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego stood strong against oppression, young voices today continue to challenge systems of injustice, refusing to bow to societal pressures and fighting for freedom and equality.

God is our Father and He's longing to speak to us and prepare us for His awesome plans. We just need to keep seeking His face and be available. You're never too young to be used by Him.
